REGISTRATION

Signed copies of the Summer School Registration Form should be dropped off to the Guidance Office. All forms must be submitted to complete registration.

**Failure to sign up for credit recovery summer school classes may result in a five year high school plan instead of four.

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STUDENT EXPECTATIONS

Attendance

Summer school is an intensive and compressed academic experience. Semester long courses are taught in a six week block, instead of an eighteen week semester. Because of the abbreviated time frame, attendance is critical. Plan vacations, doctor's appointments, etc. when summer school is NOT in session. There are no excused absences in summer school.

High school credit will not be given to students dropped due to attendance reasons.

The attendance policy for summer school is as follows:

1. All students are expected to be on time to class.
2. Parents or guardians must notify the school at 815-232-0417 on the day of an absence.
3. Students who are late to class (tardy) are charged 1/2 of one full absence.
4. Two tardies are the equivalent of one full absence.
5. Students who are more than 30 minutes late to class are charged one full absence.
6. Upon a student's third absence, the student will be dropped from summer school.

Discipline

The FHS Student/Parent Handbook is the official guidebook for summer school. All school rules and policies apply in summer school.

Any suspendable offense according to school policy will result in the student being dropped from summer school with no credit awarded and no refund if payment was made.

First incident of inappropriate behavior (other than suspendable or expellable offenses) will result in a warning. The second incident will result in the student being removed from class for one (1) day. The student will be required to remain in the Principal's Office or sent home for the day. The third instance of inappropriate behavior will result in the student being dropped from the summer school program with no credit and no refund. Detentions may also be assigned when appropriate.

Possession or use of tobacco, vapes or other illegal substances on school district property may result in the student being dropped from summer school with no credit and no refund.

Additional Rules

- **Cell phones** / electronic devices should be turned off and placed out of sight during instructional time. Phones that are not out of sight will be confiscated by the teacher and given back at the end of the session.
- No uniforms. Dress appropriately.
- Students are to park in the main student lot only.
- Students are to enter and exit the building through the I and L doors only.
- Students should use the restroom closest to their classroom. The proper restroom will be designated by the classroom teacher.
- Students should not arrive more than 15 minutes prior to the start of class.
- Students are expected to leave school grounds immediately after class ends.
- If students are given a classroom break, the break area will be determined by the classroom teacher. Students are not allowed to take their break in other areas of the building.
- Students may bring bottled water only.
- Driver's Education students waiting for bus transportation home are expected to remain in the designated waiting area until transportation arrives. Students who are disruptive or do not remain in the designated waiting area may be dropped from summer school with no credit and no refund.
