



WHERE WE WORK

Nine school buildings and two alternative sites make up the physical homes of our students and staff. It is at these places where our talented teachers and staff members focus on the academic success, social/emotional growth, and safety of our diverse student population. Here is a quick summary of each school.



BLACKHAWK ELEMENTARY SCHOOL is an eight-time Illinois Spotlight School Award recipient. The building includes 20 classrooms, a multi-purpose room with stage, gym, library, mobile computer labs, expansive playground area, and multiple play structures.



CENTER ELEMENTARY SCHOOL has a diverse student population and houses the district's High Academic Potential Program (HAPP). Students are assigned a classroom teacher, but spend time with the art, music, and physical education teachers during the week.



EMPIRE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL has been recognized as a Blue Ribbon School and a National School of Excellence. Our school has also received the Excellence Award for Exemplary Academic Performance on the Learning Standards. Our dedicated parent & volunteer communities support the students and staff throughout the year.



JONES-FARRAR INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE (IB) WORLD SCHOOL was authorized as an IB World School in June 2013. IB schools share a common philosophy - a commitment to high quality and challenging international education. The school houses 15 classrooms, a gymnasium, an inquiry center, and a computer lab.



LINCOLN-DOUGLAS ELEMENTARY SCHOOL has earned the Illinois Spotlight School distinction seven times. Students are assigned a classroom teacher, and additionally spend time with art, music, and physical education teachers during the week.



THE BANKS-BERGAGNA EDUCATION CENTER partners with students, families, and the community to educate at-risk students using social-emotional learning interventions to increase academic engagement and positive citizenship. In addition to academics, the BBEC focuses on community involvement through its service education program to develop relationships between the students, school, and community members that will extend beyond graduation.



CARL SANDBURG SCHOOL serves all 5th and 6th grade students in the District. The school is an AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination) Elementary site. AVID Elementary strategies are embedded into the daily instruction of all classrooms in order to help develop the academic habits students will need to be successful in middle school, high school, and college. The school features 40 classrooms, a gymnasium, a conference room, and a cafeteria.



FREEPORT MIDDLE SCHOOL serves all 7th and 8th grade students in the District. The school features 56 classrooms, a gymnasium, a conference room, a cafeteria, a pool, a theatre, Special Education services, and Family Resource Coordinator services. Students have the opportunity to participate in numerous extracurricular and co-curricular activities, including the district's Grammy award-winning music program.



FREEPORT HIGH SCHOOL is the sole high school serving the District. The school includes 80 classrooms, two gymnasiums, a technology wing, Pretzel Stadium, and a 400-seat cafeteria. Students have the opportunity to participate in numerous extracurriculars, including our Grammy award-winning music program. Students also have access to dual-credit opportunities, the CollegeNOW program with Highland Community College, courses through the Career and Technical Education Consortium, and AVID elective courses. Our College & Career Center also provides guidance to our students as they prepare for life after graduation. FHS is a 1-to-1 campus: all students in the school are provided with a Chromebook for their studies.



Geographically speaking, Freeport, Illinois, is a small town with a district population of 26,000 nestled in the rolling hills of northwestern Illinois. Our proximity to several larger cities, however, gives our residents all the perks of a small town - affordable housing, short commutes, and friendly neighborhoods - while allowing frequent trips to urban centers for concerts, sporting events, festivals, and other activities if you want them. WHAT ELSE DOES FREEPORT OFFER?

GREAT PARKS. Our city is home to ten parks which include an abundance of fun destinations to explore and activities to pursue. Enjoy over 36 holes of golf, miniature golf, disk golf, tennis, ice skating, swimming, hiking, biking, picnicking, kayaking, softball, a skate park, and more. We even have a waterfall, a carousel, and a miniature replica of Wrigley Field that hosts peewee baseball games and Wiffle ball tournaments.

IMPRESSIVE THEATERS. The Winneshiek Players is the country's oldest continuously running amateur theater, offering plays year round, while the Lindo Theatre, built in 1922, was designed by world famous Chicago architects C.W. Rapp and George L. Rapp. Today, it has nine screens and auditorium seating. The high school theater and community college also offer excellent productions.

IMPACTFUL HISTORY AND MUSEUMS. Stephenson County is home to more than seven museums that celebrate the rich history of the area. The second of the famous Lincoln-Douglas Debates was held right here, and social activist and Hull House founder Jane Addams was born and raised in Cedarville.

LIFELONG LEARNING. Highland Community College offers college-level credit, junior college sports teams, and a YMCA on its beautiful campus. The college offers dual-credit courses for our high school students, many of them taught by FSD145 instructors.

GOOD EATS AND DRINKS. Freeport offers multiple dining out options, which serve a variety of traditional American fare and ethnic cuisines. The area is also rich with craft breweries, wineries, and distilleries, and hosts the Pretzel City Brew Fest each fall.
