Guidance, Counseling and Social Worker Services

Each school can refer students to the proper person in their building for assistance. Elementary buildings have a full-time social worker, fifth through twelfth grades have full-time counselors, who are assigned to students. Any teacher can help students get in contact with these services.

Excessive Visits to the Nurse

After excessive visits to the health office, a conference with the student and parents may be requested. The health office is to be used only as a medical resource. Students feeling sick prior to the start of the school day, are encouraged to inform their parents/guardian prior to coming to see the school nurse.

Excusing Students from Physical Education:

If a student needs to be excused from physical education and/or recess, a written note is required from provider stating the reason and number of days to be excused. A follow up note from the provider is required to resume normal activity.

Excusing students following a long absence:

If a student has been absent three or more days, a written note from a provider is required to return to school and for all missed days to be considered excused from school.

Care of Students with Diabetes

If your child has Diabetes and requires assistance with managing their condition while at school and school functions, a 504 Plan should be developed to address the need. The plan includes the Diabetes Care Plan from the provider. Parents/guardians are responsible for and must:

- a. Inform the school in a timely manner of any change which needs to be made to the Diabetes Care Plan on file with the school for their child
- b. Inform the school in a timely manner of any changes to their emergency contact numbers or contact numbers of health care providers
- c. Sign the Diabetes Care Plan.

Communicable Diseases

The school will observe recommendations of the Illinois Department of Public Health regarding communicable diseases.

- 1. Parents are required to notify the school nurse if they suspect their child has a communicable disease.
- 2. In certain cases, students with a communicable disease will not go to school or may be sent home from school following contact of parent/guardian.
- 3. The school will provide written instructions to the parent/guardian regarding proper treatment for the communicable disease.
- 4. A student sent home because of a communicable disease will be allowed back to school only when the parent/guardian brings a letter from their provider stating that the student is no longer contagious or at risk of spreading the communicable disease.
