SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH

KRAUSE ENGAGEMENT REPORT

Brian Krause is a technology consultant that works with FSD through the ROE. He provided a summary of the work he does in coaching and working with teachers, administrators and staff.

CALL TO ACTION: EXPULSION/SUSPENSION LIMITATIONS

The Senate (SB 2423) and House (HB 3772) are advancing identical proposals from the Illinois State Board of Education that may negatively impact school safety, limit local decision-making, and undermine the ability of school districts to implement effective discipline policies by eliminating expulsions in grades K-2 and requiring superintendent approval for suspensions of students in the same grade levels. School districts must retain the ability to ensure that local policies prioritize student and staff safety. These proposals remove critical solutions needed to maintain safe and supportive school environments across our districts. Dr. Alvarado discussed some of the concerns with the proposed bills.

Dr. Maurice Davis provided updates on where we are with the percentage of staff, students and parents/guardians taking the 2025 test. We are working to reach the benchmark in all areas.

Monthly Financial Report

Enrollment and Transportation Update

An update was provided by Director Dallas Pieper. She discussed staffing, # of routes, electric buses, boundary changes, and the results of a parent survey.

Boys & Girls Club Community Grant

Rebecca Spindler, Education Director and James Rhyne, Executive Director for the Boys & Girls Club of Freeport & Stephenson County, gave an update and reviewed the evaluation of the program for the 21st Century Community Learning Centers Program for 2024.

FHS Grading Procedures & Final Report Card

Dr. Julia Cloat updated the board on Phase 3 of grading procedure and report cards. Phase 3 is for FHS. The report was piloted for the 1st semester and parent feedback was overwhelmingly positive and in favor of the new report card.

6th Grade SAWAS ELA Proposal

Present by Dr. Julia Cloat - At the time of the review it was determined and the board approved that grades K-6 would use HMH Into Reading as the ELA Curriculum. With the Early Childhood Expansion and the restructuring of 6th grade to Freeport Middle School, the 6th Grade ELA PLC (including future FMS and JFIB teachers) unanimously decided to recommend to the Board an adoption of the 2025 edition of the myPerspectives curriculum to align with grades ELA curriculum at grades 7-12.

A. Approved the naming of the Freeport School District 145 Early Childhood Center and renaming Carl Sandburg School as Jones Farrar, an IB World School, effective July 1, 2025. (At the January 21, 2025 board meeting, the FSD Board approved the creation of an early childhood center which will centralize all pre-school into one location.)
