

Freeport School District 145# requirements per Grade level for entry into School

If students don't have the required immunizations and/or physicals listed, by the first day of school, the student will NOT be able to attend until the required health forms are presented to the school nurse.

| Students entering Illinois Schools for the first time from another State | Due within 30 days of enrolling in Illinois School: State physical, Immunizations up to date, and an Eye Exam. Religious exemptions for Immunizations require a form signed by the parent/guardian and provider. |
| Preschool | Illinois State physical with immunizations up to date, <i>due before the first day of school</i> . Preschool only requires one physical, physicals must be updated for entry into Kindergarten. Religious exemptions for Immunizations require a form signed by the parent/guardian and provider. |
| Kindergarten | Illinois State physical with immunizations up to date, due before the first day of school. Immunizations should include; 4 to 5 Dtap, 4th Polio, 2nd MMR, 2nd Varicella. Religious exemptions for Immunizations require a form signed by the parent/guardian and provider. Eye Exam done by Eye Dr. due by October 15th. Dental Exam due May 15th (State Dental Form). |
| Grade 2nd | Dental Exam due May 15th (State Dental Form). |
| Grade 6th | Illinois State Physical with Tdap and Meningococcal vaccines due before the first day of school. Religious exemptions for Immunizations require a form signed by the parent/guardian and provider. Dental Exam due May 15th (State Dental Form). |
| Grade 9th | Illinois State Physical with immunizations up to date, due before the first day of school. Religious exemptions for Immunizations require a form signed by the parent/guardian and provider. Dental Exam due May 15th (State Dental Form). |
| Sports Physicals | Sports physicals are done every year students are in sports. The Sixth grade and Ninth grade physicals take the place of a sports physicals those years. Sports physicals do not take the place of a sixth or ninth grade physical as these physicals are more in depth than a sports physical. |
| High School at age 16 and is required by their Senior year of High School. | Second Meningococcal vaccine is due after 16th Birthday. |

Dr. office appointments fill up quickly. Making your appointment for vaccines and school physical exams as early as possible prevents your child from being unable to attend school. These guidelines are requirements from the State of Illinois.
