Activity 1 and Instructions	Ordering Numbers "Garbage" Grab a deck of cards and a partner. Leave all cards in the deck. Pass out 10 cards to each player, leaving the cards face down, in rows of 5. Place the remainder of the cards in between the players as a draw pile. Player 1 draws from the pile. Let's say it's a 5, the player would begin counting with the upper left card. Count over to the fifth card, remove the face down card and replace it with the 5 card. The card removed is placed next to the draw pile in a discard pile. Aces are placed as number 1 and all of the face cards are "garbage". When a player draws a face card, it is placed in the discard pile. Players would continue to take turns, until one of the players has all of their cards face up and in order.
