Split the deck(s) and each p layer turns over 2 cards that he/she will use to make a fraction. The smaller number is the numerator and the larger is the denominator.

Kid's compare fractions and the larger fraction wins and keeps the cards (unless you use a more/less coin as explained above). If the fractions are equivalent, the cards are put in the middle and the winner of the next round takes those too.

Make a subtraction sign on one and an equal sign on the other. Have the child flip a card from the "problem" pile and place it down. Next place the subtraction sign and then choose another card from the "problem" pile and then place down the equal sign. Have the child figure out the subtraction problem and choose the correct answer from the answer pile of cards. On this game, you may have to guide the child for the first couple of problem, showing them that the highest number need o be on the left, or at least that the second card they flip over will have to be smaller than the first in order for the game to work. If they don't draw one that is smaller, have them just draw again.
