

# Your Chromebook and Clever in 3 Easy Steps

## 1

### Turn on the Chromebook.

- Make sure the Chromebook is fully charged or plugged into the charging brick.
- The power button is located on the side of the Chromebook.
- Make sure that the Chromebook is connected to a WiFi network. If you need help connecting your Chromebook to a WiFi network, check out the following video.


### Log in with your Clever badge.

- Click the Clever Badge Log in icon on the screen.
- Show your Clever Badge (provided by your teacher) to the camera on your Chromebook.

# Grades K-4

Below is a list of common tasks that students need to do in a K-4 classroom.

Task	How do I do this?	Why is this important?
Sign in to a Chromebook	<b>Use a Clever Badge to sign in.</b> If that is not available, the student can sign in with Google.	Chromebooks give access to all district educational resources.
Sign in to Clever	<b>Use the Chrome browser to open the district Clever page.</b> If the page doesn't open automatically, there should be a shortcut in favorites, or type in the URL directly -- <a href="https://clever.com/in/fsd145">https://clever.com/in/fsd145</a>	Clever is a website portal that offers links to other websites. If students use the link in Clever, the student is often automatically signed in to the new website.
Clever Teacher Pages	<b>Click on the classroom icon in Clever.</b> Some teachers also use Clever to create a custom page for their classes. <small>Teacher Pages</small>	These are links to resources and websites that the teacher frequently uses with students.
Padlet	<b>Click on the Padlet icon in Clever.</b> All elementary teachers have access to Padlet to share information with students. Padlet is like a virtual bulletin board with links.	Padlet is the first place to check for assignments and class activities. Teachers will post activities by date and include links to resources.
Read a book with myON	<b>Click on the myON icon in Clever.</b> All elementary students have access to read books online through the myON website. Log in through Clever by clicking the myON icon from the Clever dashboard.	Students can find a variety of non-fiction and fiction books on myON. Emerging readers can also have the book read out loud as the student reads along. Quizzes at the end of the reading test a student's comprehension.
Read a book with Learning A-Z	<b>Click on the Learning A-Z icon in Clever.</b> All elementary students have access to reading and science activities on the Learning A-Z website. Log in through Clever by clicking the Learning A-Z icon from the Clever dashboard.	Students can use the Reading Room to select grade appropriate fiction and non-fiction books on a variety of topics. The Science Library lets students explore books, pamphlets, and career profiles related to different areas of science.
Practice Math facts with XtraMath	<b>Click on the XtraMath icon in Clever.</b> Many (but not all) elementary teachers have set up XtraMath to help students develop their math fluency.	XtraMath is a collection of free math activities. Kids will practice straightforward arithmetic problems that adapt as they learn.
Prodigy Math Game	<b>Click on the Prodigy icon in Clever.</b> Many (but not all) elementary teachers have created a classroom account for students to play the Prodigy math game.	The Prodigy math game has students practice math computation and strategies that go beyond arithmetic and fluency
