Celebrations/Recognitions

Acknowledged Women's History: March is Women's History Month. During this month, we once again commemorate the unforgettable contributions and remarkable achievements of women throughout history. This year's theme highlights women who have shattered barriers, defied expectations, and transformed the landscape of progress across the spectrum of society.

Enrollment Data

Current Student enrollment is 3687 in FSD seats.

Transportation Risk Score

Friday as a fleet our Transportation Department had a total Risk score of 98.1%. This means that less than 2% of the time, our bus drivers who were on the road on Friday were engaging in unsafe driving behaviors. Below is a snapshot of the report below that was shared with our drivers.

The report looks at 6 risky behaviors and gives each a "weight."

- Hard Acceleration-10%
- Harsh Braking-10%
- Harsh Cornering-10%
- Seat Belt Usage-20%
- Speeding-20%
- Excessive Speeding-30% (15 mph over)

Early Childhood Block Grant

The agreement on the Early Childhood Block Grant is made between ROE8 for Carroll, Jo Daviess and Stephenson Counties. Our responsibility is to agree to provide services to children ages 3-5 per the ISBE guidelines for the Preschool for All (PFA) grant. As grantee, ROE 8 will reimburse our district for the services provided as follows:

<u>Preschool for All 3-5 Funds</u> = 447,335 (Funds Four $\frac{1}{2}$ day programs (at all schools) and one full day (Lincoln Douglas)

<u>Preschool for All-Expansion Funds</u> = \$312,936 (Funds two additional full day classrooms [Empire and Blackhawk] at a much higher per pupil rate for an additional 40 students)

Details and guidelines for the grant were provided to the board members.

February Attendance & Behavior Data

Average Discipline Referrals per month per day is currently 10. Attendance is still trending in a positive direction compared to last year.

Information Reports

Fiscal Year 2022-2023 Audit

The Auditor met with the Finance Committee and Drs. Alvarado & McDermott prior to this meeting for a greater dive into the audit. No significant deficiencies or instances of non-compliance that are required to be reported were found. Net position is trending in the right direction. FSD's Estimated Financial Profile Summary score was 3.5 out of 4.

Grant Specialties Contract

For Safety & Security purposes FSD is seeking assistance in developing a competitive application for the School Violence Prevention Program (SVPP) Grant, made available through the U.S. Department of Justice. Through safety audits/assessments in consultation with school safety and security professionals along with a review of school safety research, we have identified a need for additional funds to support school safety initiatives.

MTSS Specialist Job Description

Revision of the MTSS Specialist Job Description. Based on studying the data during the first three years of implementing the Math and Reading Specialist positions, we are refining the job description of this position to emphasize the parts of the job that create the most student growth and teacher support.
